Suzanne Spahr-Dudley**



Suzanne Spahr-Dudley was nominated as Alumna in the Spotlight by the Aultman College Alumni Board for her dedication to the field

of nursing for nearly 50 years.

After graduating from the School of Nursing in 1960, Suzanne worked for Aultman Hospital until 1962. Her career then led her to Robinson Memorial Hospital, Ravenna, Ohio, as the supervisor of the pediatric unit for six years. Subsequently, she moved to rural Minnesota where she became the staff and charge nurse for a local hospital. She also volunteered for the Red Cross bloodmobile.

Suzanne moved to Atwood Lake, Ohio, and began working at Union Hospital, Dover, Ohio, for 28 years, including a position as the nursing office shift supervisor. Toward the end of her career, she worked with the community health and wellness department, which involved teaching arthritis exercise classes, CPR and health.

Along with her career in nursing administration, Suzanne is a published researcher with articles featured in *The American Journal of Nursing*, *Registered Nurse* and *Nursing* magazines.

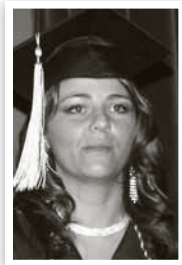

“Doing For Her Patients” – Carolyn (Crisp) Florea ‘63

Up at 2:30 a.m. Arrive in the doctor’s office by 4:30 a.m. Prepare doctor to see his patients from 6:30-10:30 a.m. Spend the rest of the workday teaching patients how to help with their treatments for Crohn’s disease and ulcerative colitis. Track patient results for research. Home at 6:30 p.m.

Her days may be full, but Carolyn (Crisp) Florea, class of 1963 wouldn’t have it any other way.

Her devotion has won accolades from her patients. Twice she has been nominated for the 2009 and 2010 Nursing Excellence Awards, sponsored by the *Atlanta Journal-Constitution*, as part of its “Celebrating Nurses” program. Carolyn was honored with a certificate that says, “In recognition of

exceptional performance, dedication and strength in improving the lives of others.” She also received a pin emblazoned with “Nursing Excellence Award” that she wears every day.

Carolyn’s enthusiasm for the nursing profession helped persuade her niece, Katie Parsell to become a nurse and attend Aultman College. When Katie graduated in May 2010, Carolyn celebrated her accomplishment by attending the graduation and pinning ceremonies where Katie was a featured speaker.

“I have been working as a nurse for 47 years and love ‘doing for my patients,’” says Carolyn in a soft Georgian accent she acquired during her 36 years there. A native of Akron, Ohio, Carolyn started her career with Aultman Hospital on “old McKinley 1” for three years, then moved to Akron City Hospital from 1966-1974 where she became the head nurse in OB-GYN.

In 1974, she and her former husband

moved to Georgia for his new job. She immediately started work at Coliseum Hospital and became involved in starting the utilization program for Coliseum Hospital and the State of Georgia. From 1981-1998, she was director of nursing at the first home health agency in Georgia.

In 1998, she became the lead nurse with the practice of Dr. Shahriar Sedghi whom she describes as, “one of the top gastroenterologists and an excellent teacher and associate professor at Mercer Medical College.” Dr. Sedghi conducts many academic research projects and counts on Carolyn to administer the medications. “I am the only one who is ‘unblind’ to who receives which prescriptions,” she explains.

Now, happily married for 19 years to a “southern gentleman,” Carolyn said she chose a career in nursing when she was 17 after her 3-year-old brother died on the operating table after an injury. The doctor didn’t ask when

“My ‘aunt-buddy’ encouraged me to attend Aultman College because the classes are small, people know your name and they really care if you pass,” said Katie Parsell, 2010 graduate and niece of Carolyn Florea. (See related article).

At the pinning ceremony, Katie offered some personal insights regarding why she chose to become a nurse and her personal pledge, which she patterned after that of Florence Nightingale. “My grandma (who suffered from Alzheimer’s disease) was placed into a nursing home where she received poor care and was often neglected. . . I solemnly promise in the presence of this assembly to care for all persons with all the knowledge, skills, and understanding that I possess. I will do everything in my power to preserve life, alleviate suffering and to promote health for my patients. . . I will care for you as if you were my family.”

the boy had had his last meal and, unfortunately, the youngster aspirated and died on the table. "I vowed to become a nurse and make sure something like that would not happen to a patient of mine," she recalls.

In 2003, Carolyn attended the 40th anniversary of her Aultman graduating class where she and about 30 of her fellow classmates reminisced about their nursing school days. "It

was an awesome time to be a student there. We learned so much and had a great deal of responsibility. I remember many of our tremendous teachers, several of whom attended our reunion.

"Roslyn Messerly, who taught surgery and is now on the College's board of directors, was among those attending the reunion. I also saw her at the May 2010 graduation ceremony.

Surprisingly, Helen Showers, who taught us med-surg, also attended graduation – at age 93," added Carolyn.

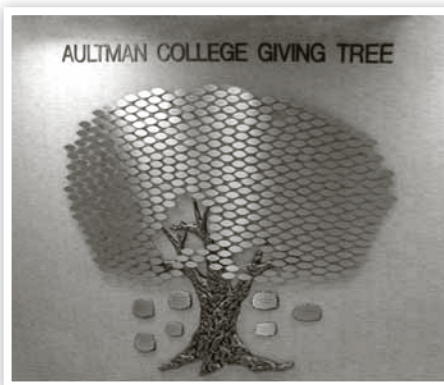
