## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What is the purpose of the CCP program?

It is a state-funded opportunity for college-ready Ohio students in grades 7-12 to earn college credit.

### Why do students take courses through CCP?

Some students want to satisfy graduation requirements. Others are done with their classes required for high school graduation and want to begin college work. Some simply want to explore college early.

### Who pays for students' tuition and books?

Taking a college course from Aultman College as a CCP student is free. That means no cost for tuition, books, or fees if you attend.

### How can CCP benefit me?

The program provides options for you to pursue rigorous course work. Under CCP, you may be able to complete up to 120 credit hours toward a college degree. Earning college credits while you're in school could reduce the time and cost of attending college.

### My school has an agreement with another college. Can I still apply to Aultman College?

Your school may have an agreement with a local college for specific courses; however, you can take CCP courses from any college that offers a course that would benefit you.

## ARE YOU READY FOR CCP?

Make sure you understand the requirements, risks, and benefits of taking college courses while you are in school. Here are some sample questions to consider with your family and guidance counselor:

- Am I ready for college-level courses? Am I independent and a self-starter?
- What classes do I still need in order to graduate from high school? What college courses could fulfill these requirements?
- How will CCP affect my participation in sports and other extracurricular activities? When should I schedule my college courses?
- If I drop or fail a course, would I have to reimburse my district school for my CCP courses? How would I fulfill my high school graduation requirements?
- How will I get to my classes on campus? Do I have reliable transportation even when the weather is bad?
- Will I feel comfortable participating in class and attending regularly?

## IMPORTANT DEADLINES

**By April 1:** Inform your school if you plan to take CCP classes the following year by completing an intent to apply form

**By May 1:** Submit transcripts and test scores, and apply to Aultman College to start fall semester

**By December 1:** Submit transcripts and test scores, and apply to Aultman College to start spring semester



## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Remediation-free according to the Uniform Statewide Standards (learn more at the CCP section at [www.ohiohighered.org](http://www.ohiohighered.org))
2. Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
3. Minimum 20 ACT (1030 SAT score) or ACCUPLACER Next Gen scores as follows: a minimum Reading score of 250 **and** a minimum Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra and Statistics (QAS) score of 263

## APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Complete the intent to apply form and submit it to your guidance counselor.
2. Apply at [www.aultmancollege.edu](http://www.aultmancollege.edu)
3. Take the ACT, SAT, or ACCUPLACER if you have not already done so. Contact our admission office at 330-363-6347 to take the ACCUPLACER for free at Aultman College.
4. Send your official school and college transcripts (if applicable) to:

5. Aultman College will evaluate application materials and placement test scores to determine program eligibility.
