Helping in Honduras



As a Peace Corps volunteer in 1979, Kathy Tschiegg ('78) was troubled by the lack of supplies and medical knowledge she encountered during her assignment at a hospital in Honduras. She resolved to make a difference. Today, the organization Kathy founded, Central American Medical Outreach (CAMO) is recognized as "the most

fiscally responsible non-government organization" by the The Honduran Ministry of Finance.

"CAMO started as a duffel bag from my living room and now has a 10,000sq ft facility in the USA with 5 employees and a 20,000 sq ft facility in Honduras with 28 employees," said Kathy. "We provide an average of 144,000 direct services a year to the poor population in Honduras through our 16 programs."

Twice a year, Kathy Tschiegg ('78) leads a team of U.S. medical and other professionals to Santa Rosa de Copan, Honduras to train local medical professionals and provide additional support. "Our goal is to integrate the medical equipment and technology into the daily workings of Central American facilities and train the staffs to use their

"Since we started, we have done over \$2,300,000 million dollars of capital projects and improvement to health facilities and community facilities."

of North Canton church headed to Haiti in early May to assist with the earthquake relief. Flying into the airport located 30 miles west of the earthquake epicenter in Port-au-Prince, the devastation shocked Alice.

"The magnitude of the conditions took my breath away," she recalled. "There had been no reconstruction after four months. It was just row after row of six-by-six foot tents with sometimes more than a dozen family members living in a single tent."

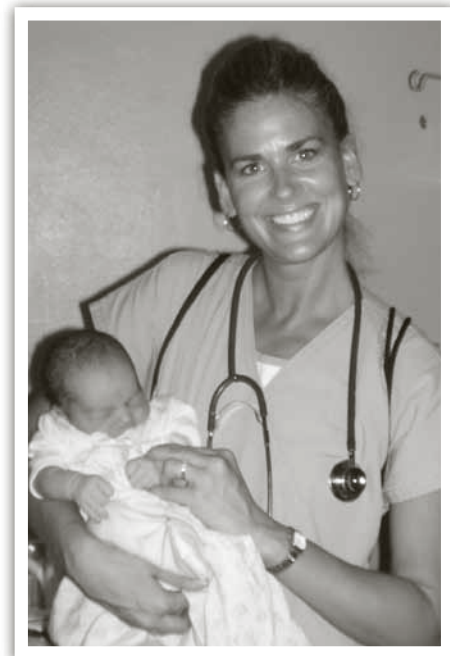
Alice worked in a clinic that provided medical care such as treating foot injuries due to the rocky terrain, distributing antibiotics and burn ointments to people in need and supplying vitamins for the Haitian children. She also helped at a food clinic that distributed bottled water, food and clothing donated by American churches.

Haitians speak Creole, a variation of the French language. Alice and her volunteer team had an interpreter assigned to help with verbal communication, but their bond with the Haitians transcended words. "There's a universal connection among people that goes beyond words," she said. "The Haitian people communicated by showing us things, patting our hands, giving us hugs and having us hold their babies."

In October, Angela Ott ('93) traveled to the Dominican Republic with members of her church, The Chapel of North Canton, to volunteer



her nursing services at a hospital in Jarabacoa. "This was my second mission trip to the Dominican Republic," said Angela. "It's very rewarding to interact with the people and experience a new culture. It always amazes me how

many more similarities than differences we share.”

Much of Angela's time was spent assessing and treating patients admitted with Dengue Fever and assisting with obstetrical examinations and deliveries. “The patients are always extremely grateful and absolutely amazed that we would travel from the United States to spend time serving them,” she said. The last time I went to the Dominican Republic we traveled out to the countryside and would set up a clinic in a house for the day. People would walk for miles in order to obtain healthcare.”

Aultman College Introduces Community Education through ACCE

Aultman College of Nursing and Health Sciences is offering CPR courses, childcare provider training courses, and computer courses as part of the launch of the Aultman College Community Education (ACCE) division. “The purpose of ACCE is to fill gaps in healthcare-related education in our community,” said Vi Leggett, administrator of the division. “In addition to serving the general public, we are planning to provide education specifically geared toward Aultman College alumni, Aultman employees, and other health care industry professionals.” Types of classes that are slated to be part of the future ACCE catalog include Spanish for Health Care Providers, Medical Terminology, and specialized courses for medical coders.

ACCE offers American Heart Association CPR training, including

Family and Friends CPR®, Heartsaver® CPR, and Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers certification and renewal courses. “We believe we are adding a valuable service for alumni, employees, patients and families who wish to stay within the Aultman system for their health care education and training,” said Brittany Fehlman, ACCE coordinator. “Our tag line is ‘Learn Your Skills From A Name You Trust.’”

ACCE courses are taught in the comfortable, state-of-art classrooms of the Aultman Education Center. ACCE also has the ability to develop customized courses for schools, groups or organizations.

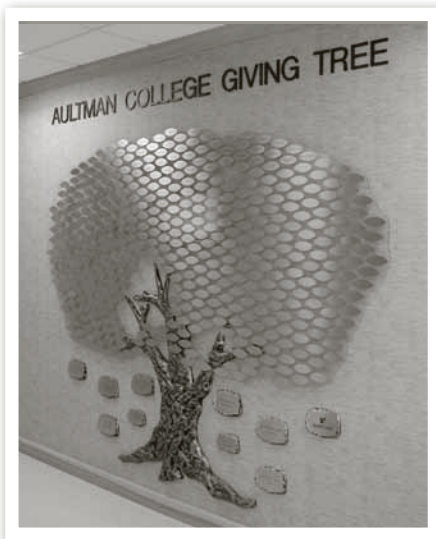
