

Endowed and Gifted Scholarships/Awards

The scholarships and awards below are available at different times throughout the academic year. Check back frequently for new applications to become available.

1892 Scholarship:

Established as a way for friends, family, and alumni to create a scholarship honoring the past Aultman Hospital School of Nursing and celebrating the future of Aultman College.

1892 President's Merit Scholarship:

Given to a student that displays outstanding academic accomplishment as evidence by achieving a high school or college GPA of 3.00 or higher and an ACT score of 25 or higher.

Alice Ott Memorial Scholarship:

Created in memory of Alice by family and friends, Mr. Ott continues to support this scholarship annually. The goal is to give to a student with interest in oncology.

AultCare General and Minority Scholarships:

AultCare appreciates the importance of teamwork, leadership, and dedication in our future leaders, so for the second year, AultCare has awarded scholarships to students attending the Aultman College of Nursing and Health Sciences.

Aultman Hospital Endowed Scholarship:

Both a need and academic based scholarship for Stark County students attending Aultman College. Established as a way to acknowledge the importance of Aultman College and the students it educates.

Aultman Scholarship Program:

A substantial scholarship awarded to an employee or the spouse or child of an employee of Aultman or its affiliates who has been employed for at least 6 months in a part-time or full-time capacity and is in good standing with the organization.

Austin-Bailey Scholarship:

The mission of the Austin-Bailey Health and Wellness Foundation is to support programs that promote the physical and mental well-being of the citizens of Holmes, Stark, Tuscarawas, and Wayne Counties in Ohio. The importance of furthering the education of health care personnel is reflected in our scholarship program as well. We offer scholarships to students in a health-related field. Currently, a \$4,000 annual scholarship is awarded to seven school of higher education for one or two of their students.

Bettie Sponseller Memorial Scholarship:

Gifted by Mr. Robert Metcalf in honor and memory of his wife Bettie, a 1942 graduate of the Aultman Hospital School of Nursing.

Josephine Walters CareStar Scholarship:

Being a part of the donor luncheon and listening to the stories our students shared prompted several members of the Class of 1959 to establish a scholarship for working parents or students caring for their parents.

David and Debbie Thiel Family Scholarship:

Established by the Thiel family as a way to provide education opportunities for the students at Aultman College.

Dianne J. Gibbs Geriatric Scholarship:

Awarded to a nursing student who is committed and passionate about caring for the geriatric patient population and has a future interest in practicing within this environment upon graduation.

Don Leggett Memorial Scholarship:

Created by the family as a way to honor their father and husband, who was a grateful Aultman patient.

Dr. Ella Scott Community Health Care Scholarship:

Created by her family and friends. This scholarship honors Ella M. Scott, PhD. RN. Dedicated to her work as a nursing professional in areas of community mental health, research and health care education. The scholarship is awarded to a minority student who has a desire to eliminate health disparities.

Eileen Welker Williams Scholarship:

A scholarship awarded to a nursing student in memory of Eileen Welker Williams. Eileen graduated from Aultman School of Nursing in 1948.

Ella Mae Kuecher Memorial Scholarship:

Scholarships awarded to a nursing student in memory of Ella Mae Kuecher. Ella Mae graduated from Aultman School of Nursing in 1928.

Elsie Schroeder Memorial Scholarship:

This scholarship was established by Vern and Mary King in honor of Mary Ann's mother, Elsie Schroeder. Elsie always wanted to be a nurse, and although she never received her formal nursing education, her compassion for those in her life led her to be an amazing caregiver. Elsie's daughter, Mary Ann is a 1957 graduate of the Aultman School of Nursing and taught in the school from 1969-1973.

Estate of Kathleen L. Greer:

Established in 2009 s a gift from the Kathleen L. Greer trust, to be used for nursing scholarships.

Estate of Mary Green:

Established in 2012 as a gift from the estate of Mary Irene Morrison Green, a 1948 graduate of Aultman Hospital School of Nursing, to be used for nursing scholarships.

Fred F. Silk Charitable Trust Scholarship:

Mr. Silk was the executive vice president of the former Massillon Paper Company, a business his grandfather started in 1870. When he died in 1995, the bulk of his estate was used to fund the foundation he started. The majority of gifts are used to support Stark County students attending Stark County colleges and universities.

Health Foundation of Greater Massillon Scholarship:

Awarded to students enrolled in a health-related degree program from Western Stark, Eastern Wayne, and Northern Tuscarawas Counties.

Helen and Nick Rajkovich Memorial Scholarship:

The Rajkovich family has established this scholarship to honor the legacy of their mom's passion for nursing and their father's unwavering support of his wife's chosen profession. Although she was a graduate of the Massillon City School of Nursing-she had a great career at Aultman Hospital and it seemed fitting a scholarship be created for Aultman College students.

Kenneth L. Calhoun Charitable Trust Scholarship:

Awarded to Aultman College students from Summit County in their last semester.

Laura B. Frick Charitable Trust Scholarship:

Aultman College was awarded this grant from this foundation to support scholarships for students residing in Wayne or Holmes Counties.

Margaret Lazar/Emma Lupher Scholarship:

Annual scholarship awarded to incoming Aultman College freshman and continuing nursing students with a minimum high school GPA of 3.00 or college GPA of 2.50 who demonstrate financial need and academic potential. Mary Roden Memorial Scholarship:

Mary was a 1926 graduate of Aultman Hospital School of Nursing she worked as a school nurse for Canton City Schools. During the war, she nursed at the Timken Company. Mary died in 1990 and it is only fitting she continue her work after death by providing scholarships for deserving men and women entering the program of nursing. Mary's estate is our largest single donation to date.

Mildred Audrey Bender Scholarship:

Mildred was a proud member of the graduating class of 1945 and dedicated operating room nurse. A gifted scholarship was given in her memory by her family to be used for nursing scholarships.

Rick and Vicki Haines Family Scholarship:

A passion for education and life-long learning, the Haines family established this scholarship in 2007 as a way to share their love of learning with Aultman College students.

SAL Compassion Award:

A scholarship established by the family of Shirley Ann Livingston Ellsworth. Shirley graduated from Aultman School of Nursing in 1949. The scholarship is awarded to a senior nursing student in good standing.

Suzanne Spahr Scholarship:

Suzanne, a 1960 graduate of Aultman Hospital School of Nursing was inspired to give back to her alma mater from her first-hand experiences of hard work and the sacrifices she made to pursue her educational dream of becoming a nurse.

T. Raymond Gregory Family Scholarship:

A scholarship awarded to a nursing student in memory of Marjorie Phyllis Gregory, R.N. The scholarship amount varies but is intended to cover 100% of tuition, fees, and supplies for the entire program. Recipients must have been successful in their first year of nursing courses, reside in Stark County, and demonstrate financial need. Preference is given to employees and children of Gregory Galvanizing and Metal.

Visiting Nurse Society Scholarship:

A scholarship gift for students of Aultman College who are studying nursing.

Wherley Family Scholarship:

Jerry and Judy Wherley instilled a strong commitment to education in each of their children and this scholarship was established to honor that value. With Wherley family roots in Tuscarawas County, this scholarship is awarded to a student hailing from that area who demonstrates academic achievement and financial need.
