ASN: Provide nursing care within the legal and ethical scope and standards of practice.

BSN: Manage nursing care within the context of legal and ethical scope and standards of practice.

- Paperwork submission as per guidelines
- Follows policy and procedures.
- Dress code or attendance violations
- Provides safe care.
- Complies with HIPPA
- Documents all data.

ASN: Promote an interdisciplinary approach to effectively use resources.

BSN: Facilitate the provision of culturally competent and holistic care to clients and communities in collaboration with the interdisciplinary team.

- o Communicates with other healthcare team members.
- Demonstrates accountability in team role.
- Asks for help when appropriate.
- o Clarifies when doesn't understand.

ASN: Utilize the nursing process to influence client outcomes across the lifespan in diverse healthcare settings.

BSN: Apply critical thinking to the delivery of evidenced-based, safe, quality nursing care to diverse populations.

- o Demonstrates knowledge of basic scientific principles
- Completes a plan of care for the client (Patient problem, realistic goals with timeframe, and evaluates client's response to interventions)
- o Utilizes evidenced-based practice when completing nursing interventions.
- o Implements appropriate teaching learning principles specific for client.
- Possesses appropriate assessment skills.
- Utilizes 2 patient identifiers during interventions.
- Administers medications (7 rights, 3 checks) safely.
- Calculates math correctly.
- Completes safety checks.
- Universal precautions followed (sterile technique, hand hygiene, gloving, isolation)

ASN: Incorporate a variety of communication modes for effective exchange of information.

BSN: Leverage information technology to maximize wellness across populations through health promotion and disease management.

- o Utilizes SBAR format to communicate with appropriate health care providers.
- o Documents pertinent client data
- o Reports changes in client condition
- Utilizes chart resources (labs, diagnostics, etc.)
- Communicates on client's level

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
